

## Terms and Conditions

### Commercial \$25 Co-Pay Program

This program is available to eligible patients with commercial insurance. Patients participating in government healthcare insurance programs are not eligible, including patients participating in Medicare, Medicaid, Medigap, Tricare, Veterans Affairs (VA), Department of Defense (DoD), or any state-funded programs. Patients must reapply for the program each calendar year. Amounts paid under the program are not eligible for reimbursement by any third party. Patients may be required to notify their insurance company of any benefits received under the program. The program is not insurance. Agios reserves the right to rescind, revoke, or amend the program at any time, without notice.

### Patient Assistance Program (PAP)

Patients must meet specified financial and eligibility requirements to qualify for assistance. Patients must have a home address in the United States (including Puerto Rico).

### QuickStart Program

In order to begin treatment with QuickStart, patients must have commercial or government insurance coverage that has been delayed by 5 business days or more. Patients must also be naive to treatment, reside in the United States (including Puerto Rico), and fall into one of the three following diagnosis categories: (a) newly diagnosed with AML and at or over the age of 75, or (b) newly diagnosed with AML and have comorbidities that preclude use of intensive induction chemotherapy, or (c) relapsed or refractory AML.

QuickStart will end once coverage is approved. The prescription will then be filled by a network specialty pharmacy, or an office- or hospital-based pharmacy.

### Coverage Interruption Program

Patients must have a home address in the United States (including Puerto Rico) and be currently taking TIBSOVO<sup>®</sup> (ivosidenib), with at least one prior commercial insurance dispense. Patients participating in federal or state health programs are not eligible.

Coverage Interruption will end once coverage is approved. The prescription will then be filled by a network specialty pharmacy, or an office- or hospital-based pharmacy.
